7.2. APPROVE A BID AWARD AND AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH COLUMBIA OIL CO. INC. FOR FLEET REFUELING AND BULK DIESEL DELIVERY - FINANCE.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve.

INFORMATION: An invitation to bid to supply gasoline through vendor operated stations and to supply bulk diesel to City owned facilities was opened on July 30, 2024. Since the City lacks any storage facilities for gasoline purchases, it requires that we depend upon a vendor supplied solutions for storage and dispensing gasoline. Diesel on the other hand is purchased in bulk and stored in a 12,000 gallon tank located at the Public Works facility, as well as a couple of smaller tanks located at Ridley Park and our Wastewater Facility.

We received two bids for bulk diesel and gasoline. Columbia Oil was the lowest bid for both aspects of the invitation. Diesel will be priced at \$.08 over the DTN rack price at the date of delivery and gasoline will be dispensed through Columbia Oil's facility at \$.10 over the OPS cost.

The agreement if approved will be for a one-year period and renewable for two additional one-year terms at the discretion of the City.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve.

INFORMATION: Bids were solicited for the mowing of the North Gateway Median Areas located on Nashville Hwy for the 2024 seasons. Bidders were given the option to offer bids for the 2025 and 2026 mowing seasons as well. We had six bidders respond. Due to the low bidder not returning all of the required information, the decision was made to go with the second lowest bidder, TN Property Management. A recommendation is made that an award be made based upon the per mowing fee of \$1,200 for the 2024 mowing season and permit the extension of the award for two consecutive annual mowing seasons at the option of the City for \$1,250 for 2025 and \$1,300 for 2026.

7.5. APPROVE ANNUAL RENEWAL OF PROPERTY INSURANCE WITH THE TML PUBLIC ENTITY PARTNERS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$244,369 - FINANCE.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve renewal of City property insurance and authorize payment to Public Entity Partners in the amount of \$244,369

INFORMATION: The City of Columbia obtains property insurance coverage through the Tennessee Municipal League's Public Entity Partners (PEP). The policy renewal for property (buildings and contents, computer equipment and mobile equipment) is July 1 of each year. An invoice for property insurance premium renewal has been received from PEP and is due for payment.

The annual premium was \$197,344 for FY 2024, \$161,591 for FY 2023, \$152,098 for FY 2022, and \$128,929 for FY 2021.

The invoice received for FY 2025 totals \$244,369. The value of city assets covered under the proposed policy increased in 2025. The increased valuation is in line with other entities that insure municipal/county governments. The city's property additions to the policy during FY 2024 and FY 2025 exceeded deletions/reductions.

The PEP Board voted not to approve a member dividend credit for FY 2025 (the same as nom increase for FY 2024).

A breakdown of cost by fund is as follows:

7.6. APPROVE PAYMENT TO MAURY COUNTY TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE MAURY COUNTY/CITY OF COLUMBIA ANIMAL SERVICES FACILITY FOR THE FOURTH QUARTER OF FY 2024 \$50,000 - FINANCE.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve.

INFORMATION: On April 14, 2016, the City Council approved an extension of the 2008 agreement with Maury County for operation of the Animal Services Facility. The 2008 agreement and extension specified that the City and County will split operating expenses (over and above revenue derived from the operation of the facility) 50/50.

The 2016 contract extension terminated on October 2, 2018. The City's FY 2024 budget includes \$200,000 for the City's contribution towards facility operations, or \$50,000 per quarter. An invoice has been received for the fourth quarter of FY 2024, which exceeds \$50,000. The invoice and supporting documentation have been reviewed by Finance.

As the operating agreement has expired, City Council approval is necessary prior to any payment towards shelter operation costs.

7.7 APPROVE ANNUAL RENEWAL OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION INSURANCE WITH THE TML PUBLIC ENTITY PARTNERS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$113,761 - FINANCE.

RECOMMENDATION: Approval of renewal of workers' compensation insurance and payment of related invoice.

INFORMATION: The City of Columbia obtains Workers' Compensation insurance coverage through Tennessee Municipal League's Public Entity Partners (PEP), and the policy renewal is July 1 of each year. An invoice for Workers' Compensation insurance premium renewal has been received from PEP and is due for payment. A breakdown of the annual premium as compared to the previous four (4) years follows:

Rates increased from the prior year due to increased claims across the PEP pool, which is responsible for the increased premium amount. No member dividend credit was issued for FY 2025.

PEP administers payment of claims, which is coordinated with the City's HR Department.

The City Council is requested to approve the renewal of City workers' compensation insurance and to authorize payment to PEP in the

amount of \$113,761.

CERTIFICATION: The Chief Financial Officer certifies that funds are budgeted and unencumbered within the General, Sanitation and Wastewater funds to pay workers' compensation insurance premiums in the amounts of \$95,496, \$9,583 and \$8,682, respectively.

INFORMATION: The City of Columbia will purchase a two-thirds page ad in the annual Nashville Vacation Guide, a bi-annual visitor resource guide in print and online, to advertise Columbia to Nashville visitors, in the amount of \$10,149.

As part of TDOT's 10-Year Project Planning process, the 2024 Statewide Partnership Program would be essential in funding the City of Columbia project to widen 7.2 miles of Bear Creek Pike (SR-99/US-412) from Nashville Highway (SR-6/US-31) to Interstate 65.

This segment of Bear Creek Pike provides a regional connection to interstate 65, and has become an increasing priority for the City of Columbia due to the impacts that increasing traffic (along this corridor) will create regarding safety, congestion, and economic opportunities. The city is currently developing plans for the Nashville Hwy and Bear Creek Pike Intersection (PIN:125912.00), and TDOT recently constructed the interchange modification project at Bear Creek Pike and Interstate 65 (PIN:115786.00). Once these two bookends of this road segment are complete, traffic will significantly increase along the

route, enhancing the sense of urgency regarding this widening project and opportunity.

The widening of Bear Creek Pike is a need which will only continue to rise. This issue is widely supported in our community, including our legislative delegation. Given the timing of the above stated projects, the timing of this application, and indeed this project, could not be better.

Partnering with TDOT would create an opportunity to accomplish this identified city goal along with enhancing and improving the local, state and federal transportation system. The City of Columbia pledges \$1,000,000 per year for 10 years (\$10,000,000) to assist in funding this project. This commitment represents what would be the largest financial commitment, in partnership with a state agency, in city history.

CERTIFICATION: The Chief Financial Officer certifies that funds will be proposed in a forthcoming budget amendment following receipt of the executed grant contract.
